
Prince Edward Island

This 11-day storybook journey by Tauck takes us to some of the most scenic—yet remote—destinations in Canada. The hotels were selected for their location, as they put you right in the heart of the best places to visit. Experience the history, heritage, ecology, wildlife, and a way of life that has been unchanged for centuries. Take the journey with us!

JULY 5: DEPART FOR HALIFAX – Upon arrival, we travel to our hotel, **Prince George Hotel**, located in the heart of the city and enjoy a welcome reception and dinner at the historic **Halifax Citadel**. (Meals: D)

JULY 6: SEASIDE LUNenburg & PEGGY'S COVE – Explore the fishing village of **Lunenburg**, choosing from a walking tour with a local guide or a visit to the **Fisheries Museum**. Later explore the pretty village of **Peggy's Cove** before returning to Halifax for dinner at our hotel. (Meals: B/D)

JULY 7: HISTORIC HALIFAX & FIRST NATIONS CULTURE – A tour around **Halifax** introduces city landmarks before a guided tour at the **Canadian Museum of Immigration at Pier 21**, the gateway to Canada for a million immigrants from 1928-1971. At the **Millbrook Cultural & Heritage Centre** we learn about the **Mi'kmaq** and their artistic traditions. Arrive at our hotel, **Delta Beausejour**, in Moncton where we dine at our leisure tonight. (Meals: B/D)



JULY 8: HOPEWELL GIANTS THAT ROCK THE SHORE – A leisurely morning at our hotel includes a talk about the environment by naturalist **Alain Clavette**, followed by lunch. Meet New Brunswick's rock stars today at **Hopewell Cape on the Bay of Fundy**. Soaring 40 to 70 feet tall, the sandstone rocks, nicknamed "flowerpot rocks," were created by tidal erosion dating back to the Ice Age. Return to Moncton for a free evening to spend as you wish. (Meals: B/L)

JULY 9: STORYBOOK PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND – Experience the Acadian culture firsthand today with a lunch on a **lobster cruise**. Then to **Charlottetown** on beautiful **Prince Edward Island**, where we'll find Victorian farmsteads, rolling green fields and red-sand beaches. **Delta Prince Edward**, our hotel for the next two nights, is located on the water's edge near the downtown harbor where dinner this evening is at your leisure. (Meals: B/L/D)

JULY 10: GREEN GABLES & SEAFARING COAST – Spend the morning at your leisure or opt for a walking tour of **Charlottetown** before heading to **Prince Edward Island National Park** to view the sand dunes, salt marshes, remnants of an Acadian forest, and the fishing village of **Rustico Harbour**. Step back in time on a visit to **Green Gables Heritage Place**, site of the home and farm that inspired Lucy Maud Montgomery's *Anne of Green Gables*. Then savor a taste of island life with dinner at a local restaurant known for its lobster dishes (Meals: B/L/D)



JULY 11: CAPE BRETON ISLAND & BRAS D'OR LAKE – After a ferry bound for Nova Scotia, ride to **Cape Breton Island**, known to the French as "Isle Royale." This island changed hands between different colonial powers creating a unique culture that blends Acadian and Gaelic traditions. Enjoy the dramatic landscape that echoes the Scottish Highlands and the shoreline cliffs of Brittany in France. After lunch, travel along the coast of **Bras d'Or Lake**, a favorite fishing spot for bald eagles. Then north to **Ingonish** for three-night stay at the **Keltic Lodge**, nestled on a promontory surrounded by the Atlantic Ocean offering a picturesque, remote, dramatic, and wildly beautiful setting. Dine at your leisure tonight. (Meals: B/L/D)

JULY 12: DAILEY LIFE ON NOVA SCOTIA – Our day begins with a wildlife presentation by a naturalist who shares insights about the animals and birds that call Nova Scotia home. The rest of the day is free to do as you please. Optional activities are available at the lodge (some at an additional cost) including golf, tennis, whale watching, and an oyster shucking demonstration, along with a "walkabout" that spotlights the history and setting of the lodge. (Meals: B/D)

JULY 13: THE AMAZING CABOT TRAIL – Journey along the **Cabot Trail**, one of the world’s most exciting and scenic drives, to a rug museum in the fishing village of **Cheticamp**. Before lunch in town, we learn about this pioneer folk. Back at the lodge tonight, join in a unique Cape Breton tradition, a “kitchen party” featuring local dishes, regional spirits, tastings, and folk-inspired Celtic music. (Meals: B/L/D)

JULY 14: GAELIC CULTURE & BELL’S INVENTIONS – Visit the **Gaelic College of Celtic Arts & Crafts at Englishtown**, where we learn about Nova Scotia’s Scottish Gaelic culture and watch a kilt-making demonstration. Then on to a tour of the **Alexander Graham Bell National Historic Site in Baddeck**. The native Scottish inventor summered and set up his laboratory in this picturesque village after moving to Canada from Scotland. We stop for lunch at a lakeside village on the Cabot Trail and continue to our lodge, **Liscombe Lodge Resort & Conference Center**, tucked away in a wooded setting on the tranquil shores of the Liscombe River. (Meals: B/L/D)

JULY 15: LAKE CHARLOTTE/JOURNEY HOME – Enroute to Halifax, we stop at the **Lake Charlotte Heritage Village**, a living history museum before continuing to the Halifax Airport: Your flight should be booked to depart after 1:30 pm. Allow three hours for flight check-in. (Meals: B)
